From I-80 & I-287 Intersection: Go East on I-80 exiting right for I-280. Continue eastward on I-280 to Exit 4A, Eisenhower Pkwy southbound. Continue on Eisenhower Pkwy ½ mi to Eagle Rock Ave. Turn right and drive ½ mi to ECEE on the left.

SATURDAY, JUNE 9 — Sunfish Pond, Delaware Water Gap National Recreational Area

Meet: 10 AM at Delaware Water Gap Dunnfield Creek/AT parking lot; see directions.
